1. Zurich Airport > Klosters

The journey takes just over 8 hours and it's a real opportunity to sit back, relax and let nature entertain you. You'll pass over the Landwasser Viaduct, travel through the Domleschg Region famous for its numerous castles, pass through the Rhine Gorge also known as the 'Swiss Grand Canyon' and lastly through the Matter Valley before arriving at magical Zermatt with the incredible Matterhorn in view. If you really want to travel in style, you can upgrade to Excellence class where you'll benefit from a guaranteed window seat, personalised concierge service and gastronomic tasting menu with wine pairing.
